Amendments for the resolutions provided in the Conference Workbook, beginning on pg. 106:

In Resolution 1, "Action on Climate Change," there are two amendments:

In the third paragraph on pg. 107:

Be it further resolved, the North Carolina Conference urges the United States Government to support and adhere to the Paris Climate ~~Accords. Walking away from these accords would be an abject moral failure~~**Agreement. A decision to walk away from this agreement precludes the possibility for the U.S. to shape this agreement as it moves forward and would thwart essential worldwide progress in addressing the critical threat of climate change**; and

In the fifth paragraph on pg. 107:

Be it further resolved, the North Carolina Conference will send this resolution to the members of the North Carolina congressional delegation, the North Carolina Speaker of the House and Senate President Pro Tempore, and the North Carolina Utilities Commission **urging them to join other states that have committed to the principles of the Paris Climate Agreement**. Concurrently, the Conference will publicize our position on climate change **including our support for U.S. engagement in the Paris Climate Agreement** through press releases to print and electronic media outlets; and

In Resolution 3, "Road Conditions in Johnston County, North Carolina," there is one amendment:

In the second paragraph on pg. 109:

Now, therefore be it resolved, we, the North Carolina Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, echo the 65th Annual Conference Session of the United Methodist Youth of the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church in urging the North Carolina Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the Johnston County Public Utilities Department, to provide ~~an~~ additional road shoulders to Johnston County roads that endanger the lives of citizens.
