The citizens of Rotifunk, Sierra Leone are experiencing a tough existence.

- Only living to an average age of 47
- 1 in 9 babies dying at birth and 1 in 8 mothers dying while giving birth
- Most babies born in Sierra Leone weigh less than 5 pounds
- 1 in 8 children will die before the age of 5
- Living on \$1.00 per day

Since 2013, Mission of Hope, a 501c3 organization, has worked to rebuild the only hospital in Rotifunk, Sierra Leone which is home to 150,000 residents. Today the hospital houses wards for men, women, children, and maternity, as well as a surgical pavilion, laboratory, and a pharmacy. Yet the needs continue to be great. Our goals are many: to adequately staff the facility with well trained doctors and nurses, to provide outreach clinics for screenings and treatment of diseases, as well as prenatal risk identification. Our greatest hope is to reduce the infant and maternal mortality rate by implementing our "Madonna Project". In this program high risk prenatal moms will be closely monitored and fed an adequate diet for 1 week prior to delivery and prepared to deliver at the hospital with a 2 day stay post delivery.

We raise funds through presentations to church and civic groups, and count on the generosity of private donors.
