## **Baptismal Reaffirmation & Intercessions (Bishop Leeland)**

Sisters and brothers,

We are united by one faith in one Lord and one God who is above, through, and in all things.

Together we share one baptism that unites us into one hope of our calling.

Baptism is the sign and seal of God's promises; through it we are incorporated into God's mighty acts of salvation – a new birth through water and the Spirit.

(water is poured by one District Lay Leader & DS)

As we remember our baptism today, I invite you to also remember God's promise by reaffirming these commitments you made, or that were made on your behalf.

On behalf of the whole Church, I ask you:

Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness,  
reject the evil powers of this world,  
and repent of your sin?

**I do.**

Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you  
to resist evil, injustice, and oppression  
in whatever forms they present themselves?

**I do.**

Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior,  
put your whole trust in his grace,  
and promise to serve him as your Lord,  
in union with the Church which Christ has opened  
to people of all ages, nations, and races?

**I do.**

According to the grace given to you,  
will you remain faithful members of Christ's holy Church  
and serve as Christ's representatives in the world?

**I will.**

Let us now join together in professing the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

Do you believe in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church,

As those who are called into ministry through our baptism, let us now devote ourselves to the work of intercession. After naming each petition, I will allow time for you to pray silently or aloud. Then I will say, "Lord, in your mercy," and you will respond, "Hear our prayer."

We give you thanks, holy and gracious God, for the gift of water. In the beginning, when nothing existed by chaos, your Spirit swept across the waters and brought forth light. Lord, for those who are weighed down by famine or flood. Where your people suffer from natural disaster, at the hands of storms or drought, wildfire or tsunami, we pray for their recovery and release.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For those caught in webs of violence, whether the devastation of war or the assaults of those close to home, deliver them from the hands of their oppressors.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

O God, in the fullness of time you sent Jesus, nurtured in the water of a womb. He was baptized by John and anointed by your Spirit. By his death and resurrection your Son, the living water, frees us from sin and death and opens the way to life everlasting.

For those who suffer in mind, body, and spirit today, including those in our connection who are absent from us right now, give courage and hope in the midst of troubles and knowledge of the love of Christ.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For those who grieve and mourn the loss of loved ones, assure them of your love and your lordship over all things, a reign that extends over life and death.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Pour out upon us, and on your whole church, the gift of the Holy Spirit, so that all who have passed through the waters of baptism might die to sin and live to God in Jesus Christ.

For your church, we pray for peace and reconciliation. Where schism has been experienced, or even where it threatens, call us to unity. For the United Methodist Church and its leaders, give us knowledge and understanding of your Word so that by our preaching and living you may be made known.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

All praise you, almighty God, through your Son Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns for ever. **Amen.**
