

Bethany United Methodist Church Celebrating 115 Years October 14, 2007

First established in the summer of 1892 on a parcel of land donated by Mr. J. B. Warren and known as Warren's Chapel, Bethany United Methodist church was built at a cost of \$1,300. Warren's Chapel was renamed Bethany at the dedication service on the 5th Sunday in October 1892. Preaching was held once a month while Sunday School tried meeting every Sunday. Many events took place to hinder the progress of the little church--harsh conditions, muddy roads, sporadic pastors--so in 1897 Bethany closed its doors for six years.






Bethany United Methodist Church as it appeared in 1966-- notice the trees.

Bethany United Methodist Church Celebrating the Past, Treparing for the Future

In 1984 Mr. Albert O. Roberts wrote "The original Bethany building was a pretty little white church which seated about 140 people. It was of Gothic design, that is the windows and the front entrance had pointed arches. This with the steeple, gave it a very churchy look. The pews, chancel and other woodwork were of heart pine; well designed and varnished. The kerosene lamps were high on the walls; on brackets which held reflectors. My father, A. T. Roberts, could stand on the floor under them and blow them out. The heating plant was a wood stove in the center aisle. For water, there was a well on the east side of the church yard. It had pulley and chain but no 'Old Oaken Bucket'. The bucket was galvanized steel. Once, as a small boy playing around the church, I managed to get the front door open and went in. I was amazed to see that the pulpit was occupied. Something with two big eyes stared out across the empty pews. It was about two feet high and it remained very still right in the center of the lectern. I sat down to listen to the sermon, but it never said a word. It was a big horned owl. His message seemed to be, 'I don't give a hoot. Keep your eyes and ears open, but if you have nothing to say, keep your mouth shut!"

After being closed for several years Bethany reopened in 1903 under the leadership of Reverend C. M. Lance with twelve members--four men and eight women. Rev. Lance organized a Sunday School which grew rapidly. Mr. A. O. Roberts wrote "The six Sunday School classes met in groups among the pews. Every Sunday each child received a card about 2 1/2 by 3 with a colored Bible picture on it. At the bottom was the 'Golden Text', a Bible verse. Most of the children went to church barefooted. This was because we sometimes did not have any Sunday shoes, and anyway we liked to go barefooted. People who lived within a mile or two walked to church. Others came in buggies, carriages, or wagons. The horses were tied to the oak trees, and they stood there for hours switching the flies away with their tails. When we had two services and a bountiful dinner on the grounds in between, the flies would leave the horses and come to dinner. The men took turns waving leafy branches over the table to shoo them away."

Mr. Roberts paints a wonderful description of the early days of Bethany that has not been captured by photos. Although the physical structure of the church has changed several times over the last 115 years, the dinners that Mr. Roberts spoke of continue and are enjoyed by the Bethany family. Sunday School classes continue to be a vital part of the worship experience along with a regular Sunday worship service.

As we look to the future of the church let us remember where we have come from and those who have worked so faithfully to make Bethany the church that it is today.









Wooden paddles made of oak are used to stir the stew. Everyone who has helped prepare stew knows what clothes smell like afterward.

Remember when the stew was really cooked in a pot? Frank Davis, Janet Truckner, Morgan Riley are pictured here in 1974 stirring the stew to keep it from sticking to the pot. The production of the stew has grown considerably over the last 60 years. In 1967 a whopping 465 quarts could be made at one time. Today between 1200 and 1300 quarts can be made, with the largest amount ever being 1345 quarts -- some say it just depends on the moon. This is one of the best fellowship activities of the church besides being a great fundraising event.


