Epworth United Methodist 408 Willard St. Wilmington, NC 28401

Bladen Street United Methodist Church was organized in January 1887 with C.W. Godwin pastor and 38 members. The church started from prayer meetings held in the home of J.G. Darden on the corner of 7th and Harnett Streets beginning the last week in November 1885. This continued to be held there every Thursday night until March 1886 when they moved in a store building across the street from the Darden home. They remained there until 1887. Under the leadership of Rev. C.W. Godwin between 1887 and 1913 the first building was built facing Bladen Street. The first service was held Easter Sunday, March 23rd with Rev. W.L. Rexford as pastor.

In 1920, the sanctuary facing 5th Avenue was completed and paid for. When Bishop Darlenton asked "What shall the name of this church be?", the pastor Rev. E.C. Sell stood and said the name of this church shall be "Epworth Methodist."

The Rev. J.A. Snow followed Rev. Sell. Then C.N. Phillips from 1925 until 1930.

During this time, the lots at 5^{th} and Willard were purchased for a new church. Rev. E.H. Smotherman – 1952-1956. During this time, the church at 5^{th} and Bladen was sold and services were held in the Education Building of Immanuel Presbyterian Church. On March 6, 1955, the first service was held in the new church. Rev. Virgil Queen, the District Superintendent, delivered the message.
