## OPHIR UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The Old Settlers of Ophir Community worshipped at Eleazer United Methodist Church for years. A church was finally organized and worship services were held in the school building until a church was built in the year 1901 on the site of Mrs. Clyde Davis' home. In 1932 this building was moved to the present location. Moving the structure as a "Community Job". To get the work done, the men turned out with their teams of horses and stump pullers. They remodeled by adding three Sunday school rooms. Then in the early 1970 stain glass windows were added, a choir loft built, new pulpit furniture added and the whole sanctuary changed - with a Portico added to the front of the church.

Our church is a beautiful little church sitting on a hill. We, our church family, are very small in number, but we are very proud of our church.

We were first in the district of <sup>Jay's Hill</sup> Montgomery County, then Rockingham and now Sanford District.
