


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CHARLIE LEE KELLY

Introduction

Around 1739, John Wesley and his brother, Charles, started their ministry in England. While they were making their impression on England with the ministry of Methodism, our country was still a colony of England and subject to its rule. Not many years passed before Methodism had reached the shores of Virginia and had continued on into North Carolina.

In 1775, Robert Williams planned a new circuit called the Brunswick Circuit. Out of this circuit, and toward the end of 1775, came a great revival that spread through fourteen counties of Virginia and through Bute and Halifax Counties, North Carolina. Through this great revival, Methodism entered North Carolina

From this revival in North Carolina, and possibly from other efforts, six hundred and eighty-three members were reported at the fourth conference held in Baltimore on 21 May 1776, and at this same conference the Carolina Circuit was added. The Carolina Circuit lay in North Carolina and its preachers were Edward Dromgoole, Francis Poythress, and Isham Tatum.

By 1780, four circuits existed in North Carolina. These circuits were Roanoke Circuit, Tar River Circuit, New Hope Circuit, and Yadkin Circuit. Roanoke Circuit was formed along the Roanoke River and probably included the counties of Bertie, Northampton, Halifax, and Warren. In 1780, Roanoke Circuit had four hundred eighty members and was the only charge in all this territory. By 1790 it had four circuits, Camden, Bertie, Roanoke, and New River and had in membership 3,072 whites and 1,220 blacks. In Grissom's account it is quoted: 1

"Roanoke will always stand in the annals of Methodist history as an honored name. It remained on the minutes for many years as one of the best circuits. Its members were distinguished for their piety and social position. Here, 'that grand old man' Lovick Pierce was born. Here, too, was the home of that silver-tongued orator, Thomas G. Lowe. In the bounds of this circuit, at the place called "the old Barn," Jesse Lee preached his first sermon. Here, the first subscription to a Methodist school in America was made by Gabriel Long and Brother Bustian. Above all, this was the cradle of Methodism in North Carolina."

After the Revolutionary War, with the colonies winning their independence from England, the ministers met in 1784 at Lovely Lane Chapel in Baltimore, Maryland. These ministers organized the Methodist Episcopal Church with Asbury and Coke being elected as the first bishops. The next spring, on 20 April 1785, the first annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South was held at Greenhill Plantation, one mile from Louisburg, with the bishops and twenty other ministers in attendance.


From this cradle sprang Ebenezer, Haywoods (near Halifax), Bradfords (near Enfield), and the Halifax Church in the town of Halifax.²

Only fifty-two years later our church was in the formation.

The Beginnings

From this fertile field of Methodism in the Roanoke Circuit the formation of Mount Tabor begins. In the *North Carolina Conference Historical Directory*, by Franklin Grill, on page 50, it is quoted: "TABOR: On State Road 48 near the Community of Aurelian Springs; Founded in 1837 and known as Edmunds Chapel according to a Church deed; earliest deed October 10, 1837, Book 30, Page 69, was Tabor Church by 1910; Membership 207."

In this deed, Benjamin Edmunds of Halifax Co. deeds to the trustees—John Carter, James Browning, William Thorne, Charles Bobbitt, Benjamin Crawley, Miles Smith, Henry Turnell, Redden Nevill, and Patrick N. Nevill—land for a church to be built. These trustees would be the very first of this church. The deed is written on 10 October 1837 for and in consideration of having a house of worship built for the members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, along a tract of one acre on the road leading from Webb's Crossroads to Brinkley's Tavern, to be known by the name of Edmunds Chapel. (Deed Book 30, page 69)

A great deal of research has gone into trying to find out as much as possible about this church. In Dr. Stephen E. Bradley Jr.'s book, *Halifax County, North Carolina Voters and Scholars 1839–1862*, on page 5, we found the first mention of Edmunds Chapel. Here we find the list of children at Edmunds Chapel in School District Two. In finding this, we knew the church really did exist. It only gave a list of children at Edmunds Chapel in School District Two. So in an effort to find its location, a descriptive narrative

was found in the County Records (CRX) files in the North Carolina State archives (Box 223, 1839–1847). The description reads as follows:

"District No. 2 bounded as follows viz beginning at the corner of No. 1 in Quall's field thence S to E 6 miles to a stake in Dr. Brownlow's Field thence N. 11 E. nearly six miles leaving Brinkley's on the west to Jas. L. Simmons on the east to a stake near Charles Bobbit's house thence N. at. 84 W nearly six miles leaving M. H. Pellway's to the south, to a point supposed to be in the Warren line between W. W. Daniel, and his premises where James Red lives thence the Warren and Halifax line to the beginning." Also, a map was used along with this description and is abstracted showing Edmund's house on a different page. In the Southern Historical Collection, Jeremy Francis Gilmer's (1818-1883) Papers, 1839-1894 and the personal and military papers of Gilmer, U.S. army engineer and Confederate Chief of engineers, we found the map showing the location of the chapel right by Edmund's house. An abstract of this map is found in this chapter. For the reader's interest, the children from Edmund's Chapel are listed as follows: "Boys-Joseph Gay, Wm. Browning, George Clark, Edward Herbert, Henderson Duffie, Benja. Browning, Jas. W. Browning, J. H. Herbert, Jesse Powers, Henry Carter, Robt. Browning, George Moore, George Herbert, and William Powers. Girls-Elizabeth Gay, Martha Browning, Sally Powers, Mary Gay, Araminta Moore, Susan Herbert, Eliza. Browning, Patience Moore, and Louisa Carter." On Gilmer's map you can see that most of these families lived around the church.

In Mrs. Myrtice Shaw's notes she writes:

"Some older people have told us of a bush arbor used for a meeting of people. They met at the site of the present day Lebanon Church. They met on land of Mr. Ben. Edmonds. It is believed that he was the founder of this move. This probably took place in the middle 1800's."

In putting all the pieces together, we know Edmund's Chapel existed, and judging from all the evidence available, the logical conclusion is that Edmund's Chapel was the church from which Mount Tabor evolved. Since so many older members tell us they knew of the "Bush Arbor," there has to be truth in this. With this in mind, knowing something happened to

Edmund's Chapel, with some saying the old church burned, the logical conclusion would be that a "Bush Arbor" was erected so that worship would continue until another church could be erected. How long it took we do not know, but we do know approximately when Mount Tabor was built and when it came into being.

Prior to 1882, it is believed that the members of Mount Tabor met for some time in a Bush Arbor. Other than the information Mrs. Shaw has stated in her notes, the compilers have been unable to pinpoint where this Bush Arbor was located, but can be fairly sure it was somewhere in the Aurelian Springs area. The only documentation is by our older members' written statements and recollections. Since the deed mentions trustees, there must have been some body of people meeting somewhere.

Mount Tabor was built between 16 May 1881 and 29 January 1883. In 1881, Robert S. Lyles and his wife, Sarah E. Lyles, deeded one acre for the sum of ten dollars to the trustees-John W. Heptinstall, Wiley M. Butts, William T. Jenkins, John O. Heptinstall, E. L. Pair, John H. Murphy, and Willis J. Lyles—for the Methodist Episcopal Church South. In 1883, Robert S. Lyles willed another acre, behind the church, to Tabor Church. It can safely be said that this one room church with wooden siding and no underpinning, which stood on a foundation of brick pillows, was built in 1881 and 1882. The two documents mentioned above are transcribed and printed on the following pages. About nine years later, Sweetman Lyles's heirs attempted to convey the one acre of land willed to the church. In Deed Book 212, page 164, Emily Lyles and J. F. Shaw of Halifax County conveyed to J. F. Shaw, W. P. Harris, E. W. Liles, J. O. Lucas, and M. W. Beal, Trustees of Tabor Methodist Episcopal Church, South, 31 January 1910, for one dollar, a tract of one acre. The acre was bounded on the south by the lands of J. W. Dickens (deceased), on the west by the lands of W. T. Jenkins (deceased), on the north by lands of W. E. Webb (deceased), and on the east by the grantors. A lien is given on the property to secure the unpaid purchase price. Witness: W. P. Harris. Registered 22 March 1910. (Deed Book 64, page 276)

In later years, the description was found to be inadequate. In this deed (Deed Book 663, page 240), Willis J. Liles and others to H. Clifton Crawley,

Harvey T. Hawkins, Sr., B. B. Liles, and J. Frank Shaw, Trustees of Tabor Methodist Church, 4 August 1961, whereas in Book 12, page 164 Emily Liles and J. F. Shaw attempted to convey the within described real property to the Trustees of Tabor Methodist Church, but the description was found to be inadequate. The parties of the first part are adjoining landowners, and have agreed to quitclaim and convey the following property to Tabor Methodist Church for one dollar for a tract of 1.7 acres in Faucetts Township on the east side of North Carolina Highway 48, as described herein. Registered 21 August 1961. More about the church will be mentioned and described in detail in other chapters.

Lyles and wife to Trustees M. E. Church Deed Book 64, pages 277 & 276 Halifax Co., North Carolina

This indenture made this 27th day of September AD 1880 between Robert S. Lyles and his wife Sarah E. Lyles of the County of Halifax and State of North Carolina of the first part and John W. Heptinstall, Wiley M. Butts, Wilson T. Jenkins, John O. Heptinstall, E. L. Pair, John H. Murphy and Willis J. Lyles of the other part witnesseth that the said Robert S. Lyles and his wife Sarah E. Lyles for the great love and affection that they have for the Methodist Episcopal Church, South and also for the sum of Ten Dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth give, bargain and sell and unto their successors in office forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the county and state aforesaid and adjoining the lands of W. E. Webb, W. T. Jenkins, and others and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a stake on the road leading from Webb's

crossroads to Brinklyville thence south 751/2 East 12 poles 16 links to a red oak thence south 3 east 12 poles 16 links to a stake with pointers thence north 75 west 12 poles 16 links to the aforesaid road thence with said road 12 poles 16 links to the beginning containing one acre more or less, to have and to hold in trust that said premises shall be used, kept, maintained and disposed of as a place of Divine Worship for the use of the ministry and membership of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South subject to the discipline, usage and ministerial appointments of said church as from time to time authorized and acclaimed by the General Conference of said church and the annual conference within where bounds the said premises are situated forever; and we the said Robert S. Lyles and Sarah E. Lyles, his wife, for themselves and their heirs do warrant and defend all the right and title that they have to the above described tract of land. In witness whereof we hereunto set our hands and seals this day and year above within.

In the name of God Amen, I Robert S. Lyles of the county of Halifax and State of N. C. being weak in body but of sound mind, memory and understanding praise be God for the same, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following;

I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah E. Lyles all my property real, personal, and mixed of which mixture or kind soever and wheresoever the same shall be at my death for the support of the said Sarah E. Lyles during her natural life and at her death the tract of land on which I now reside I give and bequeath to my nephew J. Frank Shaw for his natural life and at his death to his oldest child. I give and bequeath to my wife's neice S. Ella Faulkner the tract of land known as the Edmunds tract for her natural life and at her

death to her children and in case she has no children then the said land is to go to J. F. Shaw or his children.

I request that one acre of land behind the Methodist Church Tabor remain uncleared for the use of the church. All the personal property of my estate except that which came by my wife is to go to J. F. Shaw at her death and that, which came by her to S. E. Faulkner.

And I do nominate, constitute and appoint J. F Shaw my Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said R. S. Lylse have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 29th day of Jany 1883.

Signed declared and published by the above named R. S. Lylse as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us at his request, and in his presence have subscribed our names as witness hereto.



The Parsonages

In the very beginning of the Methodist Movement in America the Pastors traveled from place to place and stayed in the homes of members. They were called the "circuit riders." When he visited our area, Mr. Jesse Liles and Mrs. Myrtice Shaw, former members, said he stayed in the home of Mr. Willis Johnston Liles. It was not long after the church was built that the members began to want a parsonage for the traveling minister. So on 4 February 1902, W. J. Liles and wife Caroline R. Liles, of Halifax County and the state of North Carolina, to W. T. Jenkins, J. C. Butts, M. Dickens, A. M. Inge, and T. J. Rook, trustees for Roanoke Circuit of Halifax County, and State of North Carolina witnesses: "That said W. J. Liles and wife Caroline R. Liles in consideration of one dollar for one acre of land in Halifax Co., NC. The land adjoins A. Brinkley, E. W. Liles and others. The said premises shall be kept, held, and maintained and disposed of as a place of residence for the use and occupancy of the preachers of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, who may from time to time be appointed in said place subject to the usage and discipline of said church." (Registered 1 Aug 1903, Deed Book 143, page 434)

We know the first parsonage was in existence by 1903 for the Trustees, W. T. Jenkins, J. C. Butts, A. M. Inge, T. J. Rook, and M. Jenkins of the Roanoke Circuit Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in Aurelian Springs, had a deed of trust made to the Board of Church Extension of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, of the City of Louisville, County of Jefferson, and State of Kentucky, 1 August 1903, for \$125.00 with the security being one

lot containing one acre on which is situated the parsonage, barn, etc. of Roanoke Circuit at Aurelian Springs. This adjoins the lands of A. Brinkley and W. J. Liles, 90 x 55 yards to the beginning. In this deed it states it is for the place of residence of the traveling preachers. Registered Aug. 3, 1903. (Deed Book 158, page 335)

This first parsonage was used until 1923 for the ministers. Due to the placing of Mount Tabor on a charge with other churches in the vicinity, and some of these churches owning parsonages, they were located in a nearby town where the ministers preferred living instead of a rural setting. Therefore, the beautiful old parsonage was not in use and was later sold to W. L. Liles. An abstract of the deed reads as follows:

Whereas, heretofore, on the 13th day of October, 1923 at the Fourth Quarterly Conference held for Halifax Charge, North Carolina Conference Methodist Church, South, which charge succeeded the old Roanoke Circuit, and said Conference, in which said hereinafter described parsonage property was located and which succeeded to the title and ownership of the hereinafter described property, the said Quarterly Conference in session duly and regularly assembled at Halifax, NC on the date aforesaid by resolution duly and unanimously adopted and entered upon the minutes of said Conference, authorizing, empowering and directing C. L. Kelly, M. Shaw, and M. P. Crawley, who are duly appointed and acting Trustees of the hereinafter described parsonage property to sell and convey the said property for cash, the proceeds to be reinvested by the said Trustees who were by said resolution appointed a Committee for the purpose, in other parsonage property located in the Town of Halifax, NC and

Whereas, The said C. L. Kelly, M. Shaw and M. P. Crawley, Trustees have sold the parsonage property to W. L. Liles for the sum of \$700 dollars cash, and the said Trustees desire to

execute and deliver unto the said W. L. Liles. Registered 11 Dec. 1923 (Deed Book 346, page 322.)

Not until 1956, thirty-three years later, where Hawkins and Tabor became a two-charge church, was there a need for another parsonage. A history of this parsonage was printed in the "Hawkins-Tabor Methodist Charge Morning Worship and Dedication Service September 19, 1965," which is quoted here:

On September 2, 1956, under the leadership of Reverend J. B. Speight the Hawkins-Tabor Quarterly Conference agreed to build a new parsonage. It was June 1958, before both Churches agreed on a building site for the new building. The quarterly conference of July 27, 1958 gave a vote of thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Liles who had donated the land for the building. The land was valued at \$800.00.

On June 13, 1958, Hawkins Chapel Church approved the plans for the parsonage and elected their building committee. Those who served on the committee were:

Construction of the new parsonage was begun in September, 1958. the building was completed on March, 1959. The charge requested a gift of \$1,000.00 from the Mission Board of

The Methodist Church and received \$750.00. The total construction cost of the parsonage was \$11,300.97. The Reverend Max W. Dulin and family were the first occupants followed by Reverend R. M. Gradeless. The present occupant is Reverend J. Thomas Smith and family.

The debt was cleared on April 20, 1964. The Woman's Society of Christian Service of both Churches was responsible for furnishing the new dwelling. The total value of the building and accessories is estimated to be \$16,000.00.

The gift of land is supported by a deed in Halifax County, North Carolina Deed Book 637, page 257.

In Deed Book 636, page 190, Halifax County, North Carolina supports where they obtained \$7,000 to build the new parsonage. For the readers interest it is abstracted here.

T. B. Hawkins, Van Hawkins, Clarence Hawkins, Willis Hawkins, and Clifton Hawkins, Trustees of Hawkins Methodist Church, and Maynard Gupton, F. H. Cullom, H. T. Hawkins, Sr., B. B. Liles and James F. Shaw, Trustees of Tabor Methodist Church, and Roger Gupton and John H. Joyner acting on behalf of the Hawkins-Tabor Charge, made a deed of trust to the Bank of Halifax, Littleton, North Carolina, 28 August 1958, for \$7,000, with the security being a tract of one acre on the north side of the road leading from Webbs Crossroads to old Aurelian Springs, according to the plat, entitled "Plat of the Hawkins-Tabor Parsonage Lot," dated 7 June 1958 and recorded in Plat Book 8, page 93, conveyed by deed from A. W. Liles and wife to the Trustees on July 2, 1958 and recorded in Book 637, page 257. Registered Sept. 4, 1958.

This parsonage is still in use today and has had one addition since it was built. The bedrooms were enlarged, and a family room, bathroom, and deck were added.



This picture was taken of Alvin W. Liles and Julia D. Liles when they were dressed and ready to go to church. In the church is a beautiful window placed in their memory.

The New Church—Late 1800 and Early 1900

Little could be found on the new church from 1882 to 1894, except that we have a list of members with no dates or names of minister on the roll books until Rev. Frizzelle's and Rev. R. L. Davis's entries of membership were made around 1894. Some entries of membership were made prior to that date, around 1891, but no other information was given, as indicated by the abstracted rolls in the book. In the *North Carolina Methodist Journals*, little could be found because "Mount Tabor" or "Tabor," as names do not appear in the journals. The name "Mount Tabor" appears in these journals for the first time in 1926, and by then, the church's name was assumed. There is just that one instance of a marriage record found in the Halifax Co. Marriage Book, where W. W. Jones and Sallie Finch were married on 12 February 1890 at Tabor Methodist Church. So we know it had a name long before it appeared in the *North Carolina Methodist Journals*.

Since the church followed the patterns of ministers, such as those who served Ebenezer Church from 1894 to around 1938, it was assumed that T. B. Reeks (1886-1887), B. B. Holder (1888), Z. T. Harrison (1889-1890), and W. L. Grissom (1891) were the ministers for the early church, just as they were for Ebenezer Church. With these pastors leading the spiritual growth of the new church, and, in looking at the early roll, it seems that the church was much needed and was off to a very good start. The membership seemed to be composed mostly of farmers, merchants, and educators in a rural setting.

This new church was a wood framed building with pillows for a foundation. It had windows that swung out when opened to let in the cool

breeze during the hot summer days, and in the winter, the potbellied stove kept the congregation warm. Gradually, as the years went by, the stained glass windows replaced the plain windows, which are pictured at the beginning of this history. The stove was replaced by central heat and the windows were closed for air conditioning. In a sense, when this was done the church lost some of its charm and country beauty.

It is impossible to describe the beauty of some of the features inside the church, which are no longer there. An effort to preserve the history should be made. A white railing was situated facing the pulpit, which curved on both sides giving a beautiful look from the congregation viewpoint. From the railing, the pulpit was elevated, stood higher than the railing, and was accessible by a wide staircase. This was where the members kneeled to take communion. It was always a very reverent moment when the minister spoke from the scriptures almost at a whisper, and the choir sang hymns very softly as the communion was administered. The choir sat in wooden, ladder back, straight chairs to the right on a raised platform with a heavy, pleated, burgundy, velvet curtain hanging from an iron rod that separated the choir from the rest of the congregation. The original pew benches are still used today. A picture of the church decorated for a wedding is featured in a later chapter and looks much as it did then.

Around 1917, partitions were added to form Sunday school rooms. These partitions were made so that sections of the wall could be raised when large crowds were expected. This way the Sunday school rooms were used for a twofold purpose. The members could raise one or all as was needed. Further proof is provided by Deed Book 278, page 222 and is abstracted here:

"W. P. Harris, E. W. Liles, J. D. Lucas, R. W. Brown, and J. F. Shaw, Trustees of Tabor Methodist Episcopal Church, South, deed of trust to the Board of Church Extension, Jan. 11, 1917, for \$300.00, with the security being a tract of one acre adjoining the lands of the late J. W. Dickens, the Late W. T. Jenkins, and the late W. E. Webb, 12.65 x 12.65 x 12.65 yds. and to the beginning." Registered 11 January 1917 (Deed Book 278, page 222).

This lien remained on the books until 1961, as evidenced in Deed Book 663, page 309 and is abstracted here:

"Board of Church Extension subordination of lien to Tabor Methodist Church, Aug. 8, 1961, whereas the Tabor Church is indebted to the Board of Church Extension for \$300.00 by deed of trust dated Jan. 11, 1917 and recorded in Book 278, page 222, this lien is subordinated in favor of a deed of trust by Tabor Church to the Planters National Bank & Trust Co. of Roanoke Rapids for \$10,000.00." Registered 6 September 1961 (Deed Book 636, page 190). All of this took place when the Rev. William Towe was here. In Mrs. Myrtice Shaw's notes, she wrote that he started a band, and many of the young men played instruments.

Also, from the journal of the Warrenton District Conference of the North Carolina Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, we find these pastors' reports.

In 1909 in the Roanoke Circuit the Rev. Jesse T. Draper, PC gives his account:

- All country churches. Some genuinely good people. Some indifferent ones. Spiritual state of charge is scarcely good. Ordinances very well attended. Good Sunday schools at all of the churches; however, a great many of our people take no stock in them.
- American Bible society has done no work. Have taken some collections—others to come.
- Assessment plan is used for raising salaries and collections.
- Some repairs have been planned for two of our church buildings. The others and the parsonage are in fairly good condition.
- ∼ There are no Epworth Leagues."

Other pastors' reports are quoted here. This is Rev . J. T. Draper's for 1910:

Roanoke Circuit—The spiritual state of the charge is by no means what it should be. Many of our people are not as consecrated as they ought to be. We are trying to counteract this indifference by prayer and exhortation.

- We have some as good people as may be found anywhere, and I think the charge will compare favorably with other charges in the district.
- We have five Sunday schools, very well organized and doing good work. But many of our church people take no stock in the Sunday School. In this particular we receive discouragement from the church membership rather than form the outsider. We are hindered at some points by lack of sufficient teachers, who will take an interest in preparing themselves to teach.
- We have tried to increase the missionary interest in the charge, and with some success. We are planning to organize two Missionary (Woman's) Societies soon. We have collected and paid to the Treasurer of the Mission board entire missionary assessment.
- The subject of education is receiving greater attention than was before on the charge. We expect good results to follow this awakening. More of our young people are seeking an education than ever before.
- We use the assessment plan for salaries, Envelopes for Conference Collections. This plan is the best we have ever used. About 30 % of salaries and 65% of Conference Collection has been paid.

Here is a report from Rev. Towe for 1916 in the Roanoke Circuit:

- The spiritual condition conforms favorably with any charge
 I have served, and shows signs of improvement.
- $\sim\,$ No missionary territory in our bounds.
- ~ Our Woman's Missionary Society doing good work.
- ~ We have four Sunday Schools doing fine work.
- We have good schools, well attended, quite a number of our young people go to higher institutions.
- ~ Am. Bible Society doing no work: Will take collection for it!

- The assessment plan is used to collect parsonage and the other churches in reasonably good condition.
- ~ Qtly. Conf. Records are here.
- ~ We have two Leagues doing some good work.
- No candidates for the ministry.
- ~ Many of our laymen are active in church work.

In 1917 the Rev. Towe gives his report or an account of his charge and Tabor is mentioned:

- The spiritual state is comparatively good. We have many truly good members. Attendance upon the ordinances and social meetings is increasing.
- No missionary territory.
- ~ We have one woman's missionary society doing active work.
- ~ The American Bible Society is doing no work among us.
- ~ Collections will be taken for it.
- ~ Our Sunday school work is in good shape.
- Our people are awake along educational lines. We have our State High School. Nearly every school district has voted extra tax. Several young people are attending college.
- ~ The assessment plan is used in minister funds.
- We have lost one church—Bethel—by fire but we are securing funds and expect to rebuild at an early date.
- Tabor Church will soon be completed. It will be a well equipped building with six Sunday school rooms. Other two churches are in fairly good condition.
- The Quarterly Conference reference records are here for inspection.
- We have two Epworth Leagues that are doing some good work.
- We have one candidate for the ministry.
- Our Laymen are a great help to the pastor in doing the work of the church.


In this report given in 1918, Rev. Towe mentions Tabor again:

- I think the spiritual condition conforms favorably with others that I know of.
- ~ No missionary territory within our bounds.
- We have one active Woman's Missionary Society.
- Our Sunday Schools are in fine condition doing a great work.
- Our people are awakened upon the subject of education.
 Quite a number are sending their children to college.
- No work done by the American bible society. Collections are taken.
- ~ We use the assessment to raise our finances.
- Last year we lost our church by fire, Bethel. We are gathering funds to rebuild and expect to rebuild at an early date. The new church at Tabor is nearing completion. The others are in fair condition. The parsonage needs some repairs which we hope soon to make.
- ~ Quarterly Conference records are here for inspection
- We have two Leagues doing some work. The calling of many of our young men to the army has weakened this branch of work.
- No candidate for the ministry our laymen together with the stewards are doing faithful work in the development of the charge.

These reports were transcribed for the reader's enjoyment.

It is interesting to note that a real thrust for the ministers was in getting the children educated, unlike the next section, which takes for granted the idea all children will have the opportunity of an education.

With the pictures to follow, a history of this time has been completed and we will now move to the next era.

Miss Pattie Butts was of an unusual strong character. She was devoted to doing the Lord's work in many ways. One of the ways in which she did the Lord's work was when a family had sickness or problems she would go and stay for as long as a week or more to help those in need. Another way was in teaching the Sunday school class to the little children, Miss Essie, Mrs. Essie Liles Perry, said she taught her little verses and after committing the verse to memory she would give them the card. Two of the verses were: "God is love." And "now is the time." Miss Essie and Maria Morecock Pope say when the church had activities involving the children Miss Pattie would have all the mothers nursing babies and those with little ones come to her house, which was just across the road from the church, to attend to the needs of the babies and children. She was also, noted for leading the "Amen" corner at church. There is a beautiful window placed in her honor in the church.

The Later Years

Years pass, things change, and so did Tabor. The church is no longer known as Mount Tabor, but simply as Tabor. As time passed, the members wanted to have the wooden framed church brick veneered. According to Myrtice Shaw and other members, it was in 1941, when Mr. Broom was the minister, that this was accomplished. In the same year, the Tabor Missionary Society was organized. Mrs. Alford Thorne of Roanoke Rapids met with the women of Tabor Church to help them organize into a society, which is still active today.

By now, Sunday school was an integral part of the worship service on Sunday. Wilson Thomas Jenkins served as the first Sunday school superintendent. Others that followed after him were: James Frank Shaw, Charlie Kelly, Julian Shaw, John Newell, Reid Warren, Bobby Harris, Joe Lambert, and Mike Butts. This list was obtained from Mrs. Shaw's notes.

In 1962, the members saw the need for an education building. Mr. Gradless led the members into getting the task completed. This is supported by the deed abstracted below and is found in Deed Book 656, page 503.

"H. Clifton Crawley, Harvey T. Hawkins, Jr., B. B. Liles, and J. Frank Shaw, Trustees of Tabor Methodist Church, deed of trust to the Planters National Bank & Trust Co., of Roanoke Rapids, Aug. 4, 1961, for \$10,000.00, with the security being a tract of 1.7 acres in Faucets Township, conveyed to the Trustees by deed from Emily Liles and others dated Jan. 31, 1910 and recorded in Book 212, page 164. It was actually conveyed and quitclaimed

by quitclaim deed from Ruth W. Bolton and others to the Trustees on Aug. 4, 1961." Registered 21 August 1961 (Deed Book 656, page 503).

When construction started on this building, some of the men cut timber from their land and took it to the Crawley Mill to have it sawed. This helped the church to lower the cost of adding the structure. After constructing the educational building, there were more Sunday school rooms. This made it possible to take out the partitions added in 1917 for Sunday school rooms, so that the sanctuary would be bigger and more beautiful. The sanctuary was remodeled from 1982–1984 when Bobby Smith was the minister.

One other land addition of 1.75 acres was added to the property of Tabor Church on 12 May 1994. A copy of the deed and plat is shown on the next pages. In February of 2005 a picnic shelter was erected on this land. The means for building this structure were donated by Helen Hayes Butts Liles and her son, Mike Butts, and dedicated to the memory of Alpheus Butts and Catherine Marie Butts.

Other than Mr. Charlie Kelly's gift, there have been two other major donations.

Annie Pearl Crawley Higgins made a gift for the upkeep of the cemetery and Dr. Benjamin F. Martin bequeathed a sizable amount.

Tabor United Church is still active in many ways. Other than the usual Sunday morning worship, Tabor continues to have bible school as an integral part of its worship. The church still has fundraising projects, usually by serving meals to the community. Homecoming is still observed on the third Sunday in August with the service and dinner on the grounds, and now we have a beautiful picnic shelter with fans in the ceiling to keep those in attendance cool while they eat. In the past, after eating, there would be a service just for singing spiritual songs. This is no longer observed and makes for a shorter day. Bible studies still take place just about as it always did.

As we have researched the first one hundred plus years, with its many changes, it leads one to wonder what the changes will be in another hundred years. As can be seen from the foregoing history, it had its adversities, but it survived to produce many Christians with a strong religious background

to hold them in stead as they lived out their lives. Despite its adversities it continues to produce Christians with a deep abiding faith in Christ. This is truly a heritage of which to be proud.



COLLECTION OF REMINISCENCES AND TRADITIONS OF TABOR UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

I remember when the church was wood-painted white and was heated by wood. There were hickory trees just behind the church where we sat under the trees and cracked hickory nuts. Also, I remember the church windows were opened on the summer nights when we had a packed church during revival. All the little children sat on the front two rows. During this time, we had church on the first Sunday morning and the third Sunday night. There were five churches on the charge. They were Tabor, Hawkins, Corinth, Weavers, and Calvary. I taught the intermediate children's class every Sunday morning during my junior and senior years of high school.

SUE LILES DUKE

My memories consist of the tradition of "pounding the preacher." They did this every fall or at Christmas, I can't remember which, but everyone would bring some of their harvest such as sweet potatoes and whatever the farmers grew. Daddy always liked to give a ham and one he had cured, but after he stopped raising hogs he bought one. I remember the harvest supper was a big event because Mutt, Chloe, Louise Aycock, Lillian, and all the other good cooks in the church would cook the food. Mama always made candied sweet potatoes and a ham if we had one. Sometimes they had the supper in the Aurelian Springs School lunchroom. At the same time as the supper, they auctioned off things like handmade goods and, to my memory, the food, cakes, and pies were the most popular. Daddy always felt so proud if he could bring home one of his sister's cakes. The coconut was the most sought after cake. I remember he paid around seventy-five dollars for a cake, which was a lot of money during that time.

He felt like he had been gambling or something; however, we all knew it was going to the church. When I was about ten years old Mama and Daddy started taking us to Pierce's Campground Methodist Church. Daddy decided he wanted to go back to his home church, so that's what we did. I remember it seemed like a huge church with more people than I had ever seen in a church before. Then I soon found out that most everybody there was related to each other in some way. Going to church took on a whole new meaning because usually we would go down to visit Mama Mae and Papa afterwards, and then in latter years to Mutt's. Sometimes I got to spend the afternoon with Peggy, or she would go home with me. There are many others but these are the ones that stand out.

IULIA LILES ADAMS

My memories start with my mother. She loved Tabor Church and dedicated much of her time to the children while teaching Sunday school and vacation bible school. I also have fond memories of Mr. Kelly. When I was a child, we went to his pond for church picnics. Rather than spend my time on the slide or playing ball, I would stroll through the flower gardens picking beautiful flowers. He was gracious and generous in sharing cuttings from his flower garden with the ladies in the community. Most of the flowers and shrubs in our yard were from cuttings of Mr. Kelly's collection. Also, I remember Mr. Kelly would place a fresh arrangement of flowers in church for the Sunday service every Sunday that someone else had not made a commitment to place flowers there.

PEGGY LILES CALHOUN

One of the moments I treasure is when I enter the church and no one is there. I pause a few moments and reflect. I see the window of my great grandfather, Willis Johnston Liles, the progenitor of all the Liles in our church. Then I see my great uncle, Sweetman Liles, brother to Willis Liles, on the other window. In the back of me I see my great grandfather Bradford S. Jenkins and my great grandmother Della W. Jenkins. Then on the front windows are my grandmother, Bessie J. Liles, and my great aunt, Carrie J. Browning. My other great aunt Daisy Anderson is not there, but her husband, John Epps Anderson, is. These three women were sisters and daughters of Bradford S. Jenkins and Della W. Weeks. When I reflect upon these I think of the Methodist religious heritage they have passed on to me and I am so proud to be a part of this heritage.

PAULA LILES RIGGAN

I remember my grandmother, Caroline Riggan Liles, walking me to church when I was a little boy. When we had homecoming, it was an all-day event. Mama carried dinner and we had all-day services.

B. B. LILES

I remember singing in a quartet, which included Pauline Butts Hawkins, Myrtice Liles Shaw, Louise Robertson Fleming, and myself. During a revival service I had a solo part that I was to sing. When it became time for the solo I developed the hiccups. Joseph Liles, Harvey Hawkins, and John Liles were sitting in the back and laughed at me. I was so embarrassed I didn't know what to do. We ended the song with everybody giggling.

LOUISE AYCOCK LILES

One Sunday in church, when it became time to sing the hymn, my uncle Crowell Alston started singing before everyone else and sang half the first verse before everyone else started. He was very embarrassed and it remained a family joke for a long time.

MARIA MORECOCK POPE

It has always been a tradition at Tabor to light the cedar tree that grew in front of the church. I'm not a member of the church, but when I drove by the church during the Christmas season, I always looked forward to seeing the tree.

LISA BATTEN

I especially remember the Christmas programs at Tabor when I was a youngster. Each Christmas, for the children's program, Reid Warren would dress up like Santa Claus. Each year, he would see to it that there were bags of fruit, nuts and candy for all the children.

ALVIN (AL) LILES, JR.

When I was a young girl we lived next door to the old parsonage. Rev. Towe came from Roanoke Rapids to be our minister. He turned this community up side down. He convinced Mr. Sam Patterson of Patterson Mills in Roanoke Rapids to give musical instruments for the men of Tabor to have a band. Uncle Jim Liles played the slide trombone. They met at Mr. Brinkleys old store building to practice. They played in church for Sunday Church services. The church was a one-room building at that time. While Rev. Towe was there, Sunday school rooms were added. Rev.Towe stayed four years and did things that hadn't been done before. My sister Mamie's father-in-law succeeded Mr. Towe as our minister. He lived in the old parsonage that can still be seen today.

ESSIE LILES PERRY

When I was a little girl my sister, Sue, and I would walk to church with my brothers. Mama would tell Sue not to let me pick blackberries. We both would end up picking blackberries on the way home.

VICKY LILES LANCASTER

Tabor always had a good choir. Jim Liles, Roger and Alpheus Carlisle, and Claude Futrell sang in a quartet. Over the years, we have had many good singers. Margaurite Iles Liles, Maude Iles Sauls, and Viola Iles Kelly led the group. I especially remember the beautiful cantatas the choir sang at Christmas, directed by Ted Oxenham. Later, after Mr. Oxenhams' death, his wife, Mildred Oxenham, directed the choir. God really blessed Tabor with these two talented musicians. Mrs. Oxenham was one of the most dedicated Christians I have ever known.

LOUISE AYCOCK LILES

I came to Aurelian Springs as a schoolteacher where I met and married my husband, John Wesley Heptinstall. The first time I attended Tabor Church, I was asked to teach the men's class. Upon opening the Sunday school lesson I looked up over my book and there was my husband and my fatherin-law. I really felt intimidated. Later, John Wesley started teaching the men's class and I taught the ladies' class. I felt more comfortable teaching the ladies.

LAURA HEPTINSTALL

Mr. C. L. Kelly came to the Aurelian Springs community to live with the Cook family. While there, he decided to join Tabor Church. Having come from a Baptist background, he requested he be baptized by immersion. The minister and other church members escorted him to Warren Mill Pond, where his request was granted. He is the only person I have ever known from Tabor that was baptized by immersion. Later, he became an outstanding member of the church and community.

MAMIE LILES BAILEY

Mary Liles Keeter has been a special Sunday school teacher for a number of years. In her lessons she always has something special to share with her class. She has been an inspiration to others and especially to me. She has inspired me to get up and go to church when I really wanted to sleep late. We used to have a large class of women attending Sunday school every Sunday. This was where we shared a lot of problems with each other. Also, we had a lot of love for each other and for Mary. She puts forth the same effort for two or three that she does for fifteen in a class.

For a number of years she was the only representative we had at Methodist conference and the United Methodist Women's district meetings. She has been the United Methodist Women's treasurer for many years and has done an excellent job. She has taught us so much about the love of God and love for each other. She is a wonderful Christian inspiration for us and we can always depend on her to do her share of anything that will help Tabor United Methodist Church.

We are blessed to have Mary and her family as part of our church family.

LINDA S. LILES

Joe Lambert, my daddy, was the most kind and loving man I've ever known. He had a special way of always putting others first. My memories of him at church are how he would take up the offering with his son, who was just a little boy. In later years he would do the same with his grandsons. I remember how communion seemed to be so reverent to him and also, the giving and receiving of Sunday school pins was very important. Another important fact about my daddy was that to him everyone had a voice and should be heard whether he agreed with them or not.

Now that Daddy is in heaven and knows the answers to all his questions, he is still very much loved here on earth.

HIS DAUGHTER, KAREN ELLIS

Joe Lambert was dedicated and faithful to his church for as long as he lived.

It happened in October of 1965, when we were having our annual revival service. Sammy was seven, Neal was five, and Mickey was two and a half months old. I took them with me to revival that night; Sam could not go with us. After the service, when the minister gave the altar call, I told Sammy and Neal to follow me. I took all three of them to the altar and we knelt to pray. Sammy was on one side of me and Neal was on the other side. I thanked God for sending us three precious baby boys to love. While at the altar, I realized that God loaned my children to us for a time on this earth. They were really His children so I gave each one back to God and asked him to keep them in his care. God has been with each one of them daily for all of their lives. I thank God for the blessings we have shared for so many years. It was a wonderful experience for us that night, and Uncle Ed Liles said it was a beautiful thing to see. I have always loved him for making that comment.

LINDA S. LILES

Our churchwomen were known for cooking really good Brunswick stews. When the Women's Society cooked a stew for a fundraiser, Chloe Shearin and Mutt Shaw, both excellent cooks, would add their special ingredients or seasoning to the stew, which gave us such a good reputation.

PAULA LILES RIGGAN

It was a pretty Sunday morning, June 4, 1933. The sun rose on the wedding day of Nancy Pauline Butts and Harvey Taylor Hawkins. Many years later, they would be known to us as Nanny and Big Daddy, but on this day they were just two young people eager to begin their lives together.

They would not take their vows at the Tabor Altar. Instead, they would run away from the church, looking over their shoulders all the way to Emporia, Virginia to stand before J. Sol Wrenn, Justice of the Peace.

Louise Aycock Liles remembers Harvey asking her if she would go in the church and get Pauline. Louise remembers thinking, "He must think I have the nerve to do it."

We were all in church the next day, for everyone was in church back then. Louise went to get Pauline when Sunday school was over. We just knew Mr. Roger and Mr. Alpheus were going to see us.

Roger and Alpheus Carlisle were Nanny's uncles, both of whom were straight arrows who sang in the choir. She knew that once the service began, they would look out over the congregation and find she was not there. By then, though, the service had started, and it would be too late. The result of that union brought strong, Christian, active members by marriage and birth.

PAM HAWKINS BALLEW

They were just little baby shoes, fashioned out of white cotton twine, much like the thread used to tie tobacco to a stick. The tight, crochet stitches were made by Nanny's, Pauline Butts Hawkins, maiden aunt, Gertrude Carlisle. Aunt Gertie was the sister of Nanny's mother, Kate Allen Carlisle Butts.

She lived in the Carlisle home place, now the home of Debbie Crawley Barrow.

Many times at Christmas, a group from the church would go caroling there, and Aunt Gertie would have a small, tabletop cedar tree that she had no doubt cut down herself from the woods behind the house. She would bring out a plate of sliced gingerbread that was her specialty.

Her hands were small, almost frail, but her nimble fingers were made for the crochet needle. She used this talent to make dollies and all kinds of things. The shoes, however, had a prolific life.

The first notable appearance was the day my father, Harvey Taylor Hawkins Jr., was christened at Tabor Methodist Church. The shoes have subsequently been worn on christening days by Pamela Kaye Hawkins Ballew, Wendy Taylor Hawkins Strickland, and Harvey Taylor Hawkins III, all at Tabor.

The shoes made their first "out-of-town" appearance at First United Methodist of Marion, North Carolina with the christening of Caleb Winslow Ballew. A dilemma arose when, with the arrival of twins, Olivia Hamill Ballew and Elias Taylor Ballew, there were four feet and one pair of shoes. Not one to let propriety supersede tradition, Pam placed one shoe on each twin and allowed the other foot to be bare for their christenings.

The shoes came back to Tabor for the christening of Holden Barkley Strickland, son of Wendy H. Strickland and Jackie Watkins, Jay, Strickland Jr.

Finally, Kate Elizabeth Hawkins, daughter of Doris Elizabeth Boseman Hawkins and Taylor Hawkins, was the latest in the Butts-Hawkins line to be christened wearing Aunt Gertie's creation.

We look forward to carrying on this tradition.

PAM HAWKINS BALLEW

On Sunday, not long after their marriage in March of 1956, Selma Olivia Jenkins Hawkins and H. T. Hawkins Jr. were attending church as usual. Upon seeing there was no one to play the piano for Sunday school, Mr. C. L. Kelly (then Sunday school superintendent) asked if there was anyone who could play. Someone offered, "H. T.'s wife could play."

Thus began Mama's gift of music to Tabor Church.

When the organ was given to the church, Elizabeth Crawley, wife of Percy, was the organist. I can still see her in the white choir robe and black collar, which was what the choir wore back then. Mama always said Mrs. Crawley had the prettiest hair she had ever seen, and Mrs. Crawley insisted that her shampoo of choice was Octagon soap.

Anyway, Mrs. Crawley realized she needed a break from being organist each Sunday and asked Mama if she would consider helping her play two Sundays a month. Mama was a fine pianist, but the organ was a different story. Playing with both your hands and your feet seemed a bit daunting, but she agreed to try. I remember going with Mama to the church to practice, and now wonder how there is any ivory left on the keys.

I don't recall the actual date Mama began playing the organ, but I do remember thinking how weird it was to see her come out and take her place on the organ bench instead of Mrs. Crawley. I also remember how nervous she was and how proud I was.

Thus, in the history of organ music at Tabor Church, there have only been two organists, Elizabeth Crawley and Selma Hawkins.

PAM HAWKINS BALLEW

The day bore no real significance other than being a vivid snapshot in a child's memory and my recalling the feeling of being safe and happy, despite the scratchy crinoline. I was probably about six years old.

The day was a bright, warm Sunday morning. In those days the church was not air-conditioned. Neither was much of anything else, for that matter. The stained glass windows were opened (tilted inside from the top), and I remember smelling and feeling the fresh air. We were singing "This Is My Father's World," and the words, "I rest me in the thought of rocks and trees, of skies and seas" seemed so appropriate. The song seemed so happy, and as a young child, my mind wandered to Sunday dinner and hoping Mama would let me go down to Janet Aycock's to play that afternoon.

I still remember exactly where I sat that day. There was a long pew setting just in front of the Sunday school classrooms on the north side of the church (on the left hand side from of the back of the church). The pew faced the side of the congregation. Mama was playing the piano, but for some reason I was not sitting with the rest of my family. I was sitting on this pew with Louise Heptinstall, Jirva, and her daughter, JoJo Burgwyn. I still remember Mrs. Jirva smiling down at me and asking if I wanted to sit next to JoJo.

That's all. Just a snapshot. But the feeling of security in the heart of a small child on a Sunday morning is what I remember.

PAM HAWKINS BALLEW

I remember as a little boy going to choir practice with Mama and meeting Ashley Riggan Furman there at church. At Christmastime there were lights on a huge cedar tree that was right next to the education building. We used to climb up in the tree with the multi-colored bulbs all around us. I thought that was one of the most beautiful things I had ever seen. That tree was quite a familiar Christmas symbol in the Aurelian Springs community.

We had so much fun going to the parsonage for UMYF. Mrs. Evelyn Smith, Rev. Bobby Smith's wife, was our group leader. Our group consisted of Sherry Butts Alston, Elsie Butts Babb, Traie Mayo, Ashley Riggan Furman, Amy Harris, Joey Lambert, and myself. I especially remember learning all the books of the bible and in which testament they could be found.

When the church was remodeling the sanctuary the UMYF had a Christmas shop at the annual fall bazaar. We made Christmas ornaments and various crafts, raising enough money to buy one of the new light fixtures for the sanctuary. We were so proud because we had made a visible difference.

We had holiday parties of all kinds. I remember having costume parties at Halloween and Mrs. Smith would have pumpkin shaped cookies. At Christmas she would let us help her decorate her Christmas tree. I'm sure she had to redecorate it after we left. We had Easter egg hunts and "Fun Days" where we just went over and played games.

TAYLOR HAWKINS, III

It seems that all children love to play in the cemetery. We use to love to go out in the cemetery and climb on the stones and read the names. As a child, I remember playing among the stones for what seemed like hours. It was a wonderful mysterious place. I notice now that my own daughter and her church friends share the same attraction.

TAYLOR HAWKINS III

The most memorable Sunday schoolteachers I had were; Brenda Warren Shearin and Paula Riggan. They were great teachers and they always let us get away with anything. Almost every Sunday, after we finished our lessons, we would play a game called Faith, which was like Bingo. We loved to play that game.

Every once in a while when the teacher was out we would have a special treat. Sam Liles would substitute and he was fantastic.

TAYLOR HAWKINS III

My Mama, Ruth Warren Bolton, was always very active in church. She insisted that we go to church every Sunday when we were growing up. She played the piano for Sunday school and church, was the communion stewardess for many years, and she worked with vacation bible school. Sometimes she would arrange for the choir to sing at funerals. She instilled the importance of church in the lives of her children.

HARRY (BUDDY) WARREN

My husband, Reid Warren, was always devoted to the church. When he was a young man, his mother would furnish the wood that he cut for the church potbellied stove. He would go early to start the fire and get the church warm for the worshipers when they arrived. In later years, he would go early to turn on the oil furnace for morning worship or any church function.

PHOEBE WARREN

The white wood-frame church was brick veneered in 1941. I remember this because Willie Leon Liles and I were married that same year. Preacher Broom performed the ceremony and Margaurite Iles Robertson sang. Lois Crawley Wood played the piano. Roger Gupton, Kenneth Rice, and Mrs Broom were witnesses. There was a beautiful floral bouquet of summer flowers decorating the altar, left from the Sunday morning worship service.

UNDINE ISLES LILES

I was only four years old, growing up and living at the Heptinstall home place. Walter Morecock had a car and, on his way to church, he would swing by my house to pick me up. One Sunday I waited and waited. After a while, I thought I had waited long enough, so I put my foot in the path and walked to church. Later, I found that one of his family members was sick.

HANNAH HEPTINSTALL

Back when I was young and impressionable (the 1950s and 1960s), if you were in the presence of Tabor's seniors, the name of "Capt'n Jenkins," or Wilson Thomas Jenkins, held a place of awe and respect. He was called Captain due to his distinguish service in the Civil War. After the war he married Sarah Carter and lived in the community.

Two beautiful windows in the church are in their memory. He was a church leader, serving as a trustee, and was the first superintendent for many years.

EDWARD F. BUTTS, IR.

A number of people have asked who the people were on certain windows, namely John Frank Jackson, J. Frank Shaw, and Eunice Ann Butts. Frank Jackson was a native of Mississippi who married Eugenia Heptinstall, the daughter of the Rev. John Wesley Heptinstall. He was also a veteran of the Civil War. He lived at the old "Jackson Place," the portion of the Heptinstall estate that Eugenia inherited. Frank Shaw was the father of the James Frank Shaw of whom we all knew. He was a trustee of the early church. Eunice Butts was the daughter of "Miss Pat Butts," who died at the young age of twenty of a heart ailment. She assisted the teachers at the old Aurelian Springs School, which was across the road from Tabor.

EDWARD F. BUTTS, JR.

One of Tabor's members, whom I remember best, was Eddie Wilson Liles. "Mr. Ed," as everyone referred to him as, was a familiar sight every Sunday morning at Tabor as well as an avid visitor of church folks.

EDWARD F. BUTTS, IR.

One of our special memories at Tabor Church was when our daughter, Lynley Faith Liles, great great granddaughter of Willis Johnston Liles, was christened. The Rev. Jim Pearson performed the ceremony. At the christening Lynley wore a dress and cap previously worn by her mother, aunts, and grandmother. The hand tatted cap and dress was made by her great great Aunt Lucille Rushton. The dress was hand tucked and embroidered with tatted lace of the finest thread to give that delicate baby appearance. Many years later a family friend, Ruby Sharber, tatted booties for Lynley that matched her cap and dress. Many relatives and friends were there for the occasion. After service all went to open house at Lynley's home.

GREG AND KAY LILES

Little things that take place in a church can have a lasting memory for a child. This was the case with Mr. and Mrs. Buck Heptinstall. Mr. Heptinstall was very much a gentleman and very polite. He attended church every Sunday and he sang in the choir as well. He could be heard above everyone else when he sang. I use to like to sing beside him because I could sing as loud as I liked and no one would know I was singing. Mr. Heptinstall would regularly forget to bring his glasses to church. When this happened and it came time for the choir to sing, everything going on in the church would stop while Mrs. Heptinstall would lean over the pew to hand him her glasses and he would reach over from the choir loft to take her little round spectacles to use. They seemed to work for him,

also. After the choir sang everyone would again wait while he returned them to her. Not a word was ever said and things went on just as if it was part of the service.

As a little girl observing all this take place I would think how on earth he could see out of her glasses. Now when my husband and I use each other's glasses for one reason or another, I always think of Mr. and Mrs. Heptinstall.

RUBY CARLTON SHARBER

On December 24, 2000, Laursen Victoria Lancaster, the daughter of Marshall and Karen Lancaster, of Silver Spring, Maryland, was christened at Tabor United Methodist Church. She is the granddaughter of members Sankey and Vicki Lancaster. Guests attending were grandparents, Dr. J. C. Ayers Jr., of New Bern, North Carolina, Paul Dunn of Washington, North Carolina. Following the service, Sankey and Vicki hosted a luncheon in the fellowship hall for everyone attending.

Laursen's sister, Anna Page Lancaster, was christened on April 18, 2004. Guests were grandparents, Dr. J. C. Ayers Jr., of New Bern, Paul Dunn of Washington, North Carolina and great grandmother Twyla Albright of Hemingford, Nebraska. Sankey and Vicki hosted a luncheon in the fellowship hall for those attending the service.

Both Laursen and Anna Page wore the dress worn by their mother, Karen, at her own christening. The dress of fine Egyptian cotton was exquisitely handcrafted with a smocked bodice and tiny embroidery stitches, which embellished the hemline.

Laursen and Anna Page were the great great great grandchildren of Willis Johnston Liles.

SANKEY AND VICKI LANCASTER

Miss Mercer remembers, when she was ten years old, going to Tabor on a horse and buggy with her daddy. Some of the memories she recalls were at that time. Tabor had a circuitriding minister, the cemetery had been started, and the Epworth League was an integral part of the church. The charge was Ebenezer, Corinth, and Tabor. The parsonage was behind Mary Keeter's house. Miss Patt Butts was Big Mamma's aunt and was the Sunday school teacher. She remembers Aunt Bet shouting down the aisle, "Amen!" to the pastor.

MERCER DICKENS CRAWLEY HUX TRANSCRIBED BY PAULA RIGGAN

Roger Gupton says he remembers walking to school barefoot, but Mama made us wear shoes to church. One Sunday, when walking home, it was very evident that my shoes were hurting my feet and, as we passed Mrs. Clark's house, she said, "Are your feet hurting your shoes?"

ROGER GUPTON

When I think of my Mom, Rosa Mae Gupton, I remember how devoted she was to Tabor Church. Some of the things my Mom did were: cooking stews for homecoming, baking coconut and red velvet cakes, and supporting UMW women with her service and food. Fundraising was right down her line, for she donated much of her cooking and time. She was an inspiration for younger people in the church.

LISA GUPTON

Back in the days when folks "went to town" maybe once a week and the only amusements consisted of movies, bowling, and an occasional dance, we were pretty much confined to creating our own entertainment. One of the most popular homemade undertakings was the infamous "Womanless

Wedding," and Tabor Methodist often got into the act. Everybody in the community would show up to see their favorite farmer dolled up for the nuptials. The first such event, I remember, took place at the Aurelian Springs High School auditorium, and my daddy, H. T. Hawkins, drew the biggest laughs as he strutted down the aisle wearing a floral dress and matching high heels, compliments of Aunt Pearl Aycock. A blonde, shoulder-length wig, a long string of beads, and a redlipped mouthful of chewing gum completed the ensemble. Years later, the second such event would put daddy in the lead female role as bride. Right after John Newell, the preacher, pronounced them husband and wife, the bride swept his groom, Billy Mayo, off his feet and carried him kicking and screaming out of the building. Those were the good ol' days.

PAM BALLEW

This was a good money making event where everyone enjoyed the entertainment and had good fellowship. Since childhood, H. T. Hawkins has been very faithful to Tabor Church especially to the choir.

Rosa Mae Gupton was the M.Y.F. leader when I was a teenager. She had just married Maynard Gupton, thus becoming a part of our church. The first time I ever went to a swimming pool was on an M.Y.F. outing. Rosa Mae came to the Taylor Place to pick me up. I was so excited I ran to the car with bathing suit and towel in hand. When we got to Roanoke Rapids my bathing suit top was missing. I had dropped it on the ground in rushing to the car. Rosa Mae let me have her top and helped me stuff it to fit. This was typical of how she was always ready to help others. Later, after I "grew up," I could still see this gift in her as she participated in all church activities.

MARY LILES KEETER

Linda Smith Liles became a part of Tabor Church when she married Sam and brought her boys to church. From the very beginning, Linda has been an active participant in all activities of the church. She is a willing and efficient keeper of records. She served as secretary for the Administrative Board for many years. She has been for many years and still is secretary for the United Methodist Women. In doing this, she keeps up with data for church suppers and stews. Linda can always be seen with her camera at special events. Much of the current history is recorded by her in this way. Linda is a devoted Christian and I turn to her often for comfort and support.

MARY LILES KEETER

In every church, there is always a quiet unassuming person who acts as a spiritual guide. For me, one of these people is Mrs. Irene Butts. She was always present at worship services with her children. For a long time she was communion steward. She performed this role with great care and no recognition. When I joined the Womans Society of Christian Service, Irene was the spiritual leader and had inspirational devotions at each meeting. When I started teaching the adult ladies class, there she was again, present every Sunday and sending cards from our class to let others know the members had missed them. Even now, in 2005 when I visit her to take her Sunday school book to her, I know she is still part of our class even though she is reading her lesson at home.

MARY LILES KEETER

Some fundraisers turned out to be a test to the saints of the church.

Mary Keeter told me that Mrs. Shaw, Mutt, made her throw all the canned corn donated to the making of the stew in the field. She felt only fresh corn should go into the stew. During most cookings, Chloe Shearin and Mutt were always there to supervise the making of this famous stew. It was always cooked in a big black iron pot, over burning wood. Wood was added to get the required amount of heat to keep the pot boiling. People driving by would see women stirring with cardboard in front of their legs to avoid burning. As different ones started adding the ingredients, Mutt and Chloe would watch the other and when the other was not looking they would slip their special ingredient into the pot, whatever that may be. Amazingly, the stew was always delicious and known throughout the community as being exceptionally good. Could this have been divine intervention?

Chloe always made the corn bread and no one questioned her abilities in corn bread making.

PAULA L. RIGGAN AND RUBY C. SHARBER

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In closing, the following poem, written in memory of John Hunter Newell, former principal of Aurelian Springs High School, as well as teacher and leader of Tabor United Church, expresses how he touched the lives of those who knew him.

"To John, With Love"

I begin this verse with the name of God, For that is where all verse should begin, you see. To speak of another first, of one who was born of sod, Would be to belittle God by the likes of me.

So to speak of John, I must first come to God's throne And offer praise and thanksgiving for the one I know. I must offer praise to God for taking him home, For that is where he had longed to go. For years he had walked among us, sharing his special gifts, Gifts of love that were wrapped in human kindness, Gifts that came from his heart with a special lift And a self-giving that was akin to blindness.

And spoke to him what eternity had to say.




