- <u>*</u> <u>INSTITUTE:</u> On County Road 1532 six miles northeast of LaGrange in the Community of Institute; Founded in 1854 as Lenoir Institute according to Conference Minutes (1854); Earliest deed December 10, 1887, Book 11, Page 400; Membership 107.
- <u>* KINSTON, QUEEN STREET:</u> 500 North Queen Street; Founded in 1855 according to local church records; Kinston appears as a preaching appointment in the New River Circuit in 1823; Earliest deed October 11, 1900, Book 25, Page 384; First Church 1900, Emmanuel 1901, Caswell Street 1913, Queen Street by 1915; Membership 1,306.

KINSTON, SAINT MARK: Corner of Larkspur Road and Ivey Road, Founded in April, 1954 according to church records; Saint John merged with Saint Mark in 1967; Earliest deed May 25, 1954, Book 350, Page 168; Membership 173.

KINSTON, WESTMINISTER: Corner of Westminster Lane and Carey Road; Founded March 23, 1952 according to a printed history; Earliest deed December 20, 1952, Book 315, Page 10; Membership 859.

LaGRANGE: 213 South Caswell Street in LaGrange; Founded in 1840 according to a cornerstone; Earliest deed February 18, 1871,. Book 20, Page 132; Membership 257.

TRINITY: On U.S. Highway 70 four miles west of Kinston; Founded in 1887 according to a church history; Earliest deed May 7, 1887, Hook 11, Page 254 conveying land to trustees of church at Falling Creek; Membership 274.

* WEBB: On State Road 55 nine miles west of Kinston; Founded August 24, 1901 according to a church history; Earliest deed August 26, 1901, Book 26, Page 506; Membership 134.

<u>WOODINGTON:</u> On U.S. Highway 258 seven miles south of Kinston; Founded January 16, 1901 according to church records; Earliest deed January 16, 1901, Book 26, Page 93; Membership 131.
