Additionally, churches donated \$1,000 to the AGAPE Cattle Project to buy a cow for an immigrant family, supplying the family with milk and enabling the family to become self-sufficient. Other cash donations help pay salaries for AGAPE staff in Armenia, office and transportation expenses for Christian relief response, and salary support for a priest and doctor in Berdzor ... one of the most impoverished places on earth. 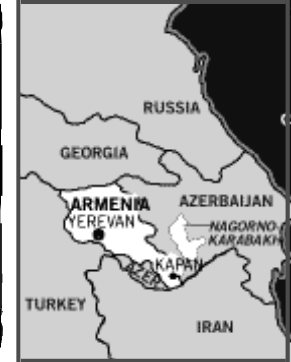
Project AGAPE was launched in 1993 and received state registration in 1994. Since its inception, AGAPE has adopted and committed to the following goals:
