December 2020





**New Schools in the United Methodist School System**

Principals from two new schools attended the November 2020 United Methodist School Principal Association's Annual Retreat at William V. S. Tubman Gray UMS in Gbarnga, Bong County.

During the 2014 Ebola crisis, the Lofa River District Superintendent, Rev. Cecilia Mapleh, began working with orphaned children in Gorlu, Lofa County. The building for the Gorlu Care UMS was completed with the support of Pastor Shaffa Seward and partners. The Sinyea United Methodist Church near Gbarnga operated a school from 1994 until 1998. The school was re-activated in 2019 in the building used for Sunday School classes. In December, I visited both elementary schools.

**4-H Liberia National Agriculture Fair**

The national office for 4-H Liberia is in the Department of General Education & Ministry where I work, and I have a wonderful relationship with the National Executive Director, G. Umaru Sheriff, and his staff.

There are currently 157 4-H Liberia Clubs at schools in 7 counties with 2445 male and 2048 female members. John Wesley UMS in Margibi County and William V. S. Tubman Gray UMS in Bong County have 4-H Clubs.

In December, 5 members from the highest performing club in each county came to Monrovia with their produce to compete in the 4-H Liberia National Agriculture Fair. I enjoyed eating fresh cucumbers, water greens, and lettuce, and serving as one of the judges. Congratulations to the first-place winner, the club from Lott Carey Baptist School in Gbarpolu County.
