This region inhabited mostly by refugees and also families from the northern regions of Armenia destroyed by the devastating earthquake of 1988 continues to be socially the most vulnerable region both in Armenia and Karabagh. After the nice concert all children receive Christmas boxes and blessings from Father Atanas, who opens the concert with Christ-

Gagik Sarajyan's family is another refugee family from Shahumian region of Karabagh currently controlled by Azerbaijan, who have survived the nightmare of the war. Now they have two children - Mariam and Liparit, who has been drafted to army just recently in May. They lost their first child in the war and another child - the twin of Mariam - because of the awful living conditions. Gagik, the father of the family, is a forester and his salary is less than \$100 a month. Their family is involved in the cattle project. "After what we experienced during the war I continue to amaze on the kindness and the Christian love

> of all those people who help us. It's amazing, that in this world full of violence and hatred, there are still angels in the face of those who continue to help the people in need..."

> Learning the stories of these two families during the cattle project regular monitoring visits there wasn't a need for extra exploration to chose families who lived in worse conditions. In several days with the help of the family members and AGAPE staff the mason leveled all the walls and constructed

JUNE 2010 WNCC BUILDING TEAM

The WNCC 2010 team of 16 volunteers under the leadership of Cecil Donahue arrived on June 16. The team divided into two parts - one to work on Yura's house located near the highway and conditionally called Highway house and the second to renovate Gagik's house which is in a village called Karegah not far from Berdzor conditionally called Village house. The excitement and morale of all - the families being helped and their friends, the team members and AGAPE

staff, was very high. In two weeks the team worked miracles changing the lives of the two families not only materially, but also psychically, giving them hope for the future. The two sub-teams managed not only rebuilding the 2 houses, but also renovating the ceiling of the delivery room and



EDUCATIONAL & OTHER ACTIVITES

It's true for all the teams that the main project of the volunteers is not the only fulfillment while being in Armenia and Karabagh. And this was the case also for the 2010 team. Just before their arrival AGAPE received a shipment from North Carolina. It was

It was God's timing really, otherwise with the limited staff of Project AGAPE it would be impossible to arrange everything as well as this timing allowed to. And just a day before the team's arrival the container was cleared and ready to go to Berdzor. Everything - the big truck transporting the goods to Berdzor plus some more construction material needed for renovation of the two community houses were ready to follow the team. Of course the big truck was slower than the vehicles taking

the team members to Berdzor and when the truck with the goods and construction material arrived all the team members were ready to help unload the goods in the warehouse and the lumber at the two community houses.

It's a tradition for each team to visit the AGAPE Hospital and the Children's Home every time visiting Karabagh. And it's becoming also a tradition to visit the families whose houses had been renovated by the VIM teams. So the WNCC team of 2010 visited those families whose houses were renovated in 2009. It was interesting for some team members who were in the team of 2009 building the roofs and the ceilings of those houses to see what was done after they left and how the families enjoy leaving in those nice transformed rooms. Valerik Avanesyan's family com-

pleted the rest of renovation works before the New Year and Christmas and celebrated those in the renovated house. And this were not the only family celebrations in their newly renovated house. Their oldest son married as soon as the house was rebuilt. The team members were pleasantly

surprised knowing that. And the family was so happy to see the team members who so generously renovated their house making their dream to see their oldest son married a reality. "You don't know what this means for me: I am sick and may not live long, but now I know that won't die without seeing this house repaired and my sons married as they were



ashamed to marry in those conditions and concerned for the health and life of their family members," says Valerik, father of the family, "And this would not happen if not

the kind hearts of people like you. May

the kind hearts of people like you. May God bless and keep the good people in the world. I don't know what would happen to us if not your help..."

The visit to the hospital ended up with the decision to renovate the ceiling of the delivery room and to patch the roof of the hospital using some new tin bought from Stepanakert, which were implemented as soon as the roofs and ceilings of the houses were completed.

Along with the hard work at the two houses the team visited the children at AGAPE Children's Home and delivered Shoe boxes to all the children of the CH. The visit of each work team is a great event for the children of the orphanage. They sing and dance for the team members who, they know and feel, love and care for them... Many of the children have never known a home, and the Children's Home gives them the feeling they have a family, gives HOPE and FUTURE.

And, of course, the nice gifts and

toys filled up their hearts with joy making the vacuity caused by the troubles of their lives a bit smaller...

The biggest surprise for the team members was the smile on the face of the youngest girl in the orphanage - little Natalie. When some team members saw her in 2009 she had just joined the children of the Children's Home and she was very sad not interacting with the children and adults and

n o t even making a n e ye contact with anyone.

When the team members saw her in 2010, she has completely changed: she was

smiling and playing, and also told a prayer for everyone. Another thing amazing all was how Boris acted after he received the shoe box. He opened it, took out all the things and started to count. After he finished this hard work and analyzed the quantity of the things in the box, he decided that he didn't need that much and started to deliver the things of the shoe box to the children and the team members.

THE FAMILIES & AGAPE STAFF CONTINUE THE RENOVATION

As soon as the team left leaving enough funds to buy construction material and to continue the renovation of the two houses, the AGAPE Staff and the families started to do the rest of the renovation of the houses. The families were provided with new doors and windows along with cement, paints,

more lumber, laminate flooring, everything needed to complete the renovation project. AGAPE staff members helped the families with constructing the plumbing systems and trained the family members to take

together the laminate flooring. Because there are some works that require special skills, a plasterer from the community was hired to complete those with precondition that he

w o u l d teach the landlords as much as possi-

ble the skills he had during the main work.

The smile never disappears from the faces of both family members. Hamest says she showed the pictures of the new roof to their son drafted to the

army just two weeks before the team started the house renovation and her son didn't believe it was their house. "Now he counts the days remained to come and see it first hand," says Hamest with tears in her eyes. "We were born in a country teaching us that it's the most humanist country in the world and we couldn't believe what was happening to us during the war in that "humanist" country. We had lost our faith... And I would never

WAREHOUSE REPAIR

Keeping the warehouse of Project AGAPE in Berdzor in good condition has always been priority, as it's very important to keep the

goods in a clean and nice environment in order to distribute those to families. Operating the distribution from the warehouse the AGAPE staff is aware through many years of experience how much impact the



on serving the families in need effectively and efficiently during the distribution and having all the construction tools, equipment and other supporting supplies in order to get what's needed in the known place and in time. Getting the

importance of the warehouse have



warehouse repaired and cleaned is very advantageous for the mentioned above purposes, but it requires funds and consumes time, which are both



changed and some closed, as during the winter it's very hard to work in the warehouse because of the low temperature. Some walls were plastered to reduce the presence of extra spaces/holes for the insects to grow. Everything

was cleaned and the dust removed from the tools, equipments, shelves and all boxes in the warehouse. This was an auxiliary but important project to support the main and the most important purpose of serving the people well.

MONITORING & PASS-ON OF HEIFERS

Siranoush is so grateful for the cow received from AGAPE, which gave her 3 offspring

basic principles of HPI. Each participating family studies animal husbandry through undergoing training and agrees to donate any female offspring to another family. In this fashion, a single gift multiplies far beyond the original investment.

Through regular monitoring visits the AGAPE staff and the veterinary hired by the Project work to ensure that the gift of each animal will eventually help an entire community to become self-sustaining. In 2009 17 families passedon the gift and the total number of the families involved became 60. The pass-on of the gift of the other participating 26 families is in the process and after its completion the number of the families involved will turn 86. Siranoush Mkhitaryan doesn't get tired to thank all those

The Cattle Project, which started in 2006 with 17 families and involved 26 more families in 2007, is a model of Heifer Project International and uses the same

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CENTER

The Christian Education Center continues to function in Berdzor, providing opportunities for enriching the religious, cultural and educational life of the community playing a substantial role in its development. The AGAPE Center provides classrooms for Christian Education and Bible teaching with accommodations for Sunday School, VBS, Art, Chess, Computer, Embroidery, Rug knitting, TESL, Sewing and other classes. For 12 years the CEC proved to be the most efficient place for the children's, teenagers', young adults' and even adults' after-school provision, as many of them received sustainable knowledge and skills that helped them to adapt to the constantly changing social-economic factors faster and easier. Computer and other trainings helped them to become more sociable, to find jobs based on skills and knowledge from the CEC.

Neither the full list nor the gratitude of those people and all the children and their parents towards Project AGAPE can be placed in this updates. "I am grateful to you, to your organization and all those kind people involved, for the knowledge and skills given to me at AGAPE Center. You helped me in my career choice, in my internal growth and sociability, that I gained through that

knowledge and self-confidence." These are the words of Hayarpy, a petite young lady who used to work at the Children's Home, and whom we saw at Karabagh Telecom office working on the computer keyboard like playing a piano. To the question where she had received those computer skills she answered gaspingly: "Where else? Of course at AGAPE Center"...

The problem that the CEC Computer Class faces now are the very old computers. 2010 was the only year when the CEC didn't have computer classes. The

> teacher that used to teach on those old computers found a better job abroad and no one agreed to teach on those computers. Hopefully the generosity of the United Methodists and UM Churches will enable getting new computers to keep up the great reputation of the CEC.



CONTAINERS AND DISTRIBUTION

Along with giving much preference to focusing efforts on long-range development in a variety of fields like housing, cattle project and education at the CEC, immediate assistance in the form of humanitarian aid is still essential in this socially most vulnerable region of both Armenia and Karabagh. The global recession highlighted malnutrition, homelessness and other forms of vulnerability and led to a level of poverty not seen in Armenia and Karabagh since 1990s, when the country was curved under the burden of both natural and man-made disasters. The flow of the people to AGAPE center could be compared only with the first years of the Project's work in this area, when there were so many people needing humanitarian aid and waiting at the gates of AGAPE Center, that a small slip would make a huge river of people angry and flow inside.

1100 families of Kashatagh region received the following aid in 2010:



- 3006 new clothing
- 99 pairs of new shoes
- 2611 kg of used clothing
- 39 bags
- 78 new blankets
- 81.3 kg used blankets and bedding
- 1074 Christmas boxes
- 66.8 kg medical supplies
- 47 new bedding
- 44 kg sewing supplies

killed in the war in Berdzor and the students of the Carving Class of the CEC. The words on the cross-stone presented by Sergey are the following:
