means for existence, we moved from Spitak and resettled in Dzorap village of Kashatagh region of Karabagh. My forth and fifth children were born here. It was hard to raise and feed our 5 children. But my husband and I worked hard to "squeeze bread out of stone" and sustain our family. Unfortunately, the inexorable fate hit me hard again: all of a sudden my husband died leaving the care for the children on my shoulders. Our older son will be drafted to the army soon, and the young son is only 8 years old. Four of my children are students. Your organization supported me as mother of many children, and I express my deep gratitude for that. I was frank and told my children everything including how well I was accepted here and what a great support I received. They were very touched and asked to write this letter on their behalf as well. Again and again, our deepest gratitude to all the people in the far country stretching the helping hand to our family, giving their love and bringing hope to us. I don't feel desperately lonely in my troubles any more. God bless them all ... "
