In the late1800's, there was a missionary from Sinoe to the United States. He was Prince Kaboo, the son of a Kru chief. His English name is Samuel Morris. His short life (1873-1893) was an amazing faith journey that led him from Sinoe in Liberia to Taylor University in Indiana. In Greenville, the Samuel Morris Center works with students in seven schools, including Harrison W. Grigsby United Methodist School (UMS). Each school has a computer lab and weekly Y Club Bible study (Y is for Youth). I participate in the Y Club with Harrison Grigsby UMS junior and senior high school students on Monday afternoons. Brother James, the facilitator, is excellent at drawing students into discussion, really thinking about God's Word.
