












The Third Day: Living the Resurrection by Tom Berlin. Connects the reader to the experiences of several individuals around Jesus in his final days, focusing on new life and redemption rather than loss.

Remember: God's Covenants and the Cross by Susan Robb. Leads readers through the covenants with Noah, Abraham, Moses and Israel, and David, followed by the New Covenant established on Maundy Thursday.

Where We Meet: A Lenten Study of Systems, Stories, and Hope by Rachel Gilmore, Candace Lewis, and Matt Temple. The authors explore their own stories, examine past shortcomings of the church, address difficult questions, and envision a brighter future that better reflects the good news of Jesus.

Toward the Cross: Heart-Shaping Lessons for Lent and Easter by Taylor W. Mills with Gary Thompson and Michelle Morris. Explore qualities and characteristics of Christian discipleship that demonstrate that following Jesus is our highest priority.

Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws by Adam Hamilton. As we study Luke and see Jesus' concern for those who were considered unimportant, we hear a hopeful and inspiring word for our lives today.

Finding Jesus in the Psalms: A Lenten Journey by Barb Roose. Combining interpretation with real-life stories, this study guides the reader through a meaningful encounter with the Psalms through the season of Lent.
