Rest in the Storm: Self-Care Strategies for Clergy and Other Caregivers by Kirk Byron Jones. Discusses the fundamental importance of self-care for clergy and other professionals engaged in helping people.

The Weary Leader's Guide to Burnout: A Journey from Exhaustion to Wholeness by Sean Nemecek. Helps pastors and Christian leaders develop an integrated approach to life, work, and ministry through healing and spiritual transformation.

Faithful and Fractured: Responding to the Clergy Health Crisis by Rae Jean Proeschold-Bell and Jason Byassee. This book brings together the best in social science and medical research, quantifying the poor health of clergy with theological engagement about what can be done about it.

Caring for Clergy: Understanding a Disconnected Network of Providers by Thad S. Austin and Katie R. Comeau. Envisions a connected network of providers offering more effective support for clergy and improving the congregations and communities they serve.

Becoming a Healthier Pastor: Family Systems Theory and the Pastor's Own Family by Ronald W. Richardson. Explores family patterns, how they operate in church situations, and how pastors can do their own family-of-origin assessment.
