Lenten Study on Gun Violence Prevention

The Bishop's Gun Violence Prevention Task Force and the Board of Church and Society encourage congregations to use the *Kingdom Dreams and Violent Realities Bible Study*, created by the General Board of Church and Society in 2016.

Focused on Micah 4:1-4, this study offers a launching point for additional discussion and sharing experiences related to gun violence, preventing loss of life, and advocating for common-sense gun laws. The study will "draw out the theological meaning of the passage, provide a window into the causes and implications of gun violence, and suggest faith-filled responses" to the challenge.
